### **Pennsylvania SERS to Begin Performance Audit Work**

HARRISBURG – The board of the Pennsylvania State Employees' Retirement System today directed staff to begin preparations for a cooperative performance audit by the state's auditing agency.

“We continually work to improve efficiencies and overall operations for the more than 236,000 members who rely on this system for their retirement benefit,” said SERS Board Chairman David R. Fillman. “We look forward to a constructive exchange of ideas and information throughout the audit process.”

As a first step, SERS staff will meet with auditors from the Department of the Auditor General in early August to discuss audit objectives and expected timeline.
