#### 6. New Business

Action 1 – Review of Board Consultant Evaluation Procedures – Assessment of SERS Independent Auditor – Ms. Lynn reviewed a recommendation originating from a Funston Advisory review for board committees to evaluate consultants and advisors under their oversight effective in calendar year 2023. Internal Audit staff currently closely monitors the annual independent audit and auditor through a variety of methods and have drafted an evaluation checklist for the committee's review at the February 2023 committee meeting. Ms. Lynn also presented a series of next steps to accomplish the evaluation in 2023.

In addition, Jim Nolan provided an update on Callan's efforts to implement a second verification of SERS investment performance calculation and revisions to the quarterly performance report with landscaping upgrades. NOTE: This item was not originally listed on the agenda and came about as a result of Investment Office staff updating the committee members on their follow up to an Internal Audit recommendation discussed at the February 25, 2022, Investment Committee meeting.

RESOLVED: That the Audit, Risk and Compliance Committee recommend to the State Employees' Retirement Board to approve the audited 2021 Financial Statements with Required Supplementary Information with Independent Auditors' Report for Fiscal Years Ended December 31, 2021, and 2020 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania State Employees' Retirement System for the Defined Benefit Plan and State Employees' Defined Contribution Plan and the audited 2021 Financial Statements with Required Supplementary Information with Independent Auditors' Report for Fiscal Years Ended December 31, 2021, and 2020 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Deferred Compensation Plan, as presented by our independent auditors, KPMG LLP.

## 9. Committee Comments/Concerns/Questions

The committee requested SERS CISO to research and report back to the committee as to which pension systems have experienced a cyber-attack as well as what Commonwealth agencies currently carry cyber insurance. Additionally, Treasurer Garrity stated that at the next meeting in September, discussion will take place on SERS' efforts to date on preparations for the upcoming



SOC audit as well as next steps. Lastly, Mr. Flannigan complimented SERS' efforts on establishing its compliance program.
